A Collaborative Approach



A Collaborative Approach

Families, schools, and the local authority work together to ensure every learner thrives.

We ask parents and carers to support regular attendance by encouraging positive routines, ensuring children arrive on time, avoiding holidays during term time wherever possible, and keeping in close contact with school if any concerns arise. Your support makes a real difference.

95–100% attendance 	 Best chance of success	 Your child is taking full advantage of every learning opportunity.
90–95% attendance 	 At least 2 weeks of learning missed	 Satisfactory. Your child may have to spend time catching up with work.
85–90% attendance 	 At least 4 weeks of learning missed	 Your child may be at risk of underachieving and may need extra support from you to catch up with work. Below 90% you are at risk of prosecution.
80–85% attendance 	 At least 5 ½ weeks of learning missed	 Your child's low attendance has a significant impact on learning. You are at risk of prosecution.
Below 80% attendance 	 At least 7 ½ weeks of learning missed	 Your child is missing out on a broad and balanced education. You are at risk of prosecution.

Thank you for working with schools and the local authority to give every learner the best possible start to the 2026–27 academic year. We look forward to supporting children, young people and families throughout the year ahead.
